



What projects should you provide?

The main considerations when selecting your projects for assessment are:

- How recent your projects are; and
- Whether the projects will be able to showcase your ability to meet the licensing competencies.

How recent should your projects be?

Ideally at least one project should have been completed in the last 3 years and both completed within the last 5 years. Projects should be built and a Code Compliance Certificate (CCC) issued.

You should read the project records questionnaire before selecting your projects. This will give you some guidance on the type of information we will be seeking about the project.

Showing you meet the licensing competencies.

Before selecting your projects we recommend that you review the licensing competencies within the LBP Rules. You can view these online here:

Your projects should show a broad range of building work that reflects your ability to carry out the performance indicators listed in the licensing competencies. You may wish to pay particular attention to the building work listed in Competency 4 for practical licenses. The licensing competencies are based on residential building work.

Ideally your projects should show your ability to carry out the work of your licence class on a complete build. This however may be reflected across both projects.

Site and Design application projects

When selecting projects for either Site or Design applications – you **must** ensure that the Building Category of the projects you select align with the Area of Practice you are applying for i.e. If applying for a Site licensing class with an Area of Practice 2 – you will need to provide at least Category 2 buildings for your projects.
