1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 ("the Appellant") of Auckland applied for a Carpentry Licence and a Site (Area of Practice (AOP) 1) Licence under s287 of the Act and the Licensed Building Practitioners Rules 2007¹ ("the Rules").
- 1.2 The Registrar of Licensed Building Practitioners ("the Registrar") declined the Appellant's application and notified his decision by letter dated 19 September 2019. Notification of the decision included a notice of the right to appeal the decision to the Building Practitioners Board ("the Board").
- 1.3 On 21 September 2019 the Appellant lodged an appeal to the Board against the Registrar's decision.

2.0 Licensing scheme

- 2.1 To become licensed, a person must satisfy the Registrar that they can meet all the applicable minimum standards for licensing.² The minimum standards are set out as "Competencies" in Schedule 1 of the Rules. In determining whether a person meets a Competency, regard must be given to the extent to which the person meets the Performance Indicators set out for that competency in Schedule1³.
- 2.2 Where the Registrar declines an application the applicant has a right of appeal to the Board.⁴

3.0 Scope of the appeal

- 3.1 An appeal proceeds by way of rehearing⁵. However, the Board will not review matters outside the scope of the appeal⁶.
- 3.2 The appeal seeks the following relief:

The grant of a Carpentry License and a Site (AOP 1) License

3.3 In light of s335(4) and the Registrar's decision letter, the Board interprets its inquiry as being restricted to consideration of Competencies 1-4 for a Carpentry License, and Competencies 1-5 for a Site (AOP 1) License.

Carpentry Licence Competencies:

- Competency 1: Demonstrate knowledge of the regulatory environment of the building construction industry.
- Competency 2: Demonstrate knowledge of current building and trade practice.
- Competency 3: Carry out planning and scheduling for carpentry work.
- Competency 4: Carry out Carpentry work.

Site Licence Competencies:

- Competency 1: Demonstrate knowledge of the regulatory environment of the building construction industry.
- Competency 2: Apply technical knowledge of construction methods and Practice.
- Competency 3: Organise and manage building projects.
- Competency 4: Manage personnel.
- Competency 5: Provide technical supervision.

4.0 Registrar's report

- 4.1 The Registrar's decision to grant or decline a licence is informed by an assessor's recommendation⁷. The Board's Appeals Procedures require the Registrar to provide a report which includes all evidence used to reach the decision, including the assessors' recommendation.
- 4.2 The Registrar's report notes, at paragraph **21 and 22** the following from the Assessor's recommendations:

"21.In making the recommendation that application for an Carpentry licence should be declined, the assessor noted the following:

- could not answer any of the regulatory knowledge questions
- When asked basic building methodology questions around foundations (both types) and construction, most of the answers were exaggerated and incorrect, the Applicant did answer some internal bracing elements correctly.
- There were inconsistencies in the dates provided for when the applicant
 was working and studying. None of the Referees could verify that the
 Applicant has been building for 4 years. The Applicant told the Assessor
 that it has been hard for him to get a Referee who has seen his work
 from day 1 as he has moved employers often.
- One Referee stated that the could not build a house as he had no practical experience.

22.In making the recommendation that application for an Site 1 licence should be declined, the assessor noted the following:

- claims that he has been in the building trade for the last 4 years building 2 and 3 storey new homes, and is now in a hands on supervision role.
- The Applicant claims to be a Site Manager but his Referee states that he is on contract as a trainee carpenter to another builder doing foundation work only. Other Referees provided either did not recommend for the Site 1 licence or could not verify they had witnessed the applicant carry out work.
- The Applicant holds no Site Safe Certificate or the like there of, and no First Aid."

4.3 The Registrar concluded:

"I have been delegated under S312 (1) to review the assessment report and make a decision about [the Appellant's] application.

I reviewed the assessor's report and [the Appellant's] application.

I based my decision on the assessor's recommendation, for the reasons set out above. I did not consider that there was sufficient reason or concern to overrule the assessor's recommendation."

5.0 Appellant's Submissions

- 5.1 The Appellant included a limited number of photographs of his work with his appeal.
- 5.2 The Board asked questions of the Appellant covering Competencies 1 for Site (AOP 1) and Carpentry, and Competency 4 for Carpentry.

6.0 Board's consideration

- 6.1 The Board noted that the Registrar was not satisfied that the Appellant met any of the Competencies for the Carpentry licence or the Site (AOP 1) License.
- 6.2 The Board then considered Competencies 1 4 for a Carpentry License and Competencies 1 5 for Site (AOP 1) License. These Competencies can be demonstrated by meeting some or all of the performance indicators as listed in Schedule 1 of the Rules.
- 6.3 The LBP scheme is competency based, and it is up to the practitioner to demonstrate their competency.

Board's findings

- 6.4 The Board concluded that the Appellant **failed to provide** evidence to demonstrate that he met sufficient Performance Indicators to satisfy the requirements of Competencies 1 for Site (AOP 1) and Carpentry, and Competency 4 for Carpentry. Based on this finding the Board did not question the Appellant on the other Competencies.
- 6.5 The Appellant had limited knowledge and experience in building work. The Board recommends that he undertakes formal training and obtains a breadth of experience prior to reapplying.

7.0 Board's Decision

7.1 Pursuant to s335(3) of the Act, the Board has resolved to uphold the Registrar's decision not to license with a Carpentry Licence or a Site (AOP 1) License.

8.0 Publication of Name

- 8.1 Pursuant to s339 of the Act, the Board may prohibit the publication of the Appellant's name and/or particulars.
- 8.2 The Board, having considered the circumstances of this appeal, directs that the name and the particulars of the Appellant **are not** to be made public.

Advice Note (not part of Board's Decision)

Extracts from the Act:

"330 Right of Appeal

- (1) A person may appeal to the Board against any decision of the Registrar to–
 - (a) decline to licence the person as a building practitioner;

. . .

- (2) A person may appeal to a District Court against any decision of the Board—
 - (a) made by it on an appeal brought under subsection (1);

. . .

331 Time in which appeal must be brought

An appeal must be lodged-

- (a) within 20 working days after notice of the decision or action is communicated to the appellant; or
- (b) within any further time that the appeal authority allows on application made before or after the period expires."
